Synopsis

In a Mughlai restaurant in Toronto, a late night visit from a mysterious stranger rattles the cage and shatters the peace. Now Ayub must face reality, the family he's left behind, and the dreams he's abandoned, all while keeping the restaurant clean to a mirror shine.

From award-winning playwright and author Anosh Irani, Behind the Moon is an achingly beautiful story of love and loss, freedom and faith, the meaning of brotherhood, and how we begin a new life.

About the Playwright



ANOSH IRANI has published five critically acclaimed works of fiction: The Cripple and His Talismans (2004), a national bestseller; The Song of Kahunsha (2006), which was an international bestseller and shortlisted for Canada Reads and the Ethel Wilson Fiction Prize; Dahanu Road (2010), which was longlisted for the Man Asian Literary Prize; The Parcel (2016), which was a finalist for the Governor General's Literary Award for Fiction and the Writers' Trust Fiction Prize; and Translated From the Gibberish: Seven Stories and One Half Truth (2019). His play Bombay Black (2006) won the Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding New Play, and his anthology The Bombay Plays: The Matka King & Bombay Black (2007) and his play The Men in White (2018) were both finalists for the Governor General's Literary Award for Drama. His one man show Buffoon (2020) won the Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding New Play. He lives in Vancouver.

Playwright's Note and Acknowledgements

My plays seem to have strange trajectories in terms of how they evolve. My previous play, Buffoon, began way back in 2005 as a commission. I wanted to write a circus play; it was called Manja's Circus back then. It had a cast of about 7. The play turned out fine, and I was even offered a production by a theatre company, but something told me to wait. It was the clown in the play. He walked out of the play and demanded his own show. That's when I realized: "Oh, this is a one person show."

With Behind the Moon, one of the characters from an earlier play of mine, The Men in White, kept haunting me. Ayub is a version of that character. I was extremely interested in his inner life. Why did he come to Canada? Who did he leave behind? Does he sleep well at night? What does he dream of? So, I wrote a short story about him called Behind the Moon, which was published in the Los Angeles Review of Books. The deeper I dug, the more he revealed himself. Until, eventually, he showed up on stage, cleaning the glass counter of the restaurant that he works in. If characters refuse to leave me, I just follow them. And listen.
