# TARRAGON THEATRE LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Tarragon Theatre acknowledges that we all are a part of a larger ecosystem within our community, Tkaronto, where our theatre lives and operates – and that we also commit ourselves and energize our audiences to continually reflect on and respond to our relationship to the land around us. This country has been cared for by generations of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Nations, and the land on which Tarragon rests and is able to share this story has been cherished and protected by the Anishnabeg, the Haudenosaunee, the Wendat, and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Toronto is a word that originates from the Mohawk word "Tkaronto," meaning "the place in the water where the trees are standing," which is said to refer to the wooden stakes that were used as fishing weirs in the narrows of local river systems by the Haudenosaunee and Wendat. The paths we still walk today, from Davenport to Dupont, are built on the portage trails first established and walked by Indigenous peoples. It is in the spirit of being on the portage route that we invoke our local Indigenous oral history – though covered up by the industrial progress of Toronto – and maintain that those stories are not lost.

We are committed to engaging with these communities in meaningful ways that open dialogue. We look towards a recognition of our shared humanity to create deeper community connection and accountability. Tarragon's recognition of the contributions of Indigenous peoples to this land is directly connected to our promise to meet the challenge of Truth and Reconciliation: making our commitment real in our work and through our community building. ## **CREATOR'S NOTE**

One day while I was working on the script for *Benevolence*, my father looked over my shoulder and asked, "Kevin, why's this Hakka stuff so interesting to you?" It was a revealing question. It struck me how within cultural diasporas, some generations feel more access to their sense of identity than others. For Hakka, a group known in Chinese as "guest families" and as China's nomadic people — our two thousand years of migration probably exacerbates those generational gulfs.

Growing up, I had a ready answer whenever I was asked about my heritage: "I'm Chinese-Canadian." Simple. But a few years ago, that confidence wavered as I began coming to terms with how little I actually understood about "being Hakka," especially when speaking with elders. If I knew anything about "Hakkaness" it was the joyful, lengthy, and often mysterious conversations my grandmother would have in the Hakka language, on the telephone with loved ones near and far. This play tries to channel a similar kind of unapologetic joy, and it hopes to interrogate some of that mystery too.

I chose to create *Benevolence* because I had a conviction that my experience was similar to that of many Canadians. Many of us are comfortable declaring who we are — the simple version — but struggle when we consider the question more deeply. I hope that sharing part of my journey of self- discovery resonates with your own questions about identity and being here in Canada. I hope also that the benevolence at the heart of this story finds its way into yours.




