DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The Season

Thank you for being here tonight. We're taking a bold leap in the development of our company, investing in the quality of storytelling, and all the while doing it with some downright incredible and challenging scripts. Our season investigates this increasingly blurry idea we call the 'truth', and will bring together some of the city's best emerging and established artists to tackle it. If you've been with us since the beginning, or you're just joining us for the first time, thank you. It means a great deal to have each and every one of you here.

The Show (Read after the play, spoilers ahead!)

When I read this play, I had a hard time believing it was written in 1992. I had just graduated from a post-secondary program, and had seen and heard about so many situations similar to what you witnessed tonight.

I wanted you to read this note after the play, because I think what is most important is your feelings towards the characters. I think it's more interesting to ask these questions in hindsight. Do you side with one over the other? Why? What could their foil have done differently to make this situation better? Or was it all inevitable?

For my part, I don't side with one or the other. I think that both characters are in many ways, very wrong and very right. All I really have to say about the play is this: This has happened, it is likely happening, and it will happen again.
