TARRAGON THEATRE LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Tarragon Theatre acknowledges that we all are a part of a larger ecosystem within our community, Tkaronto, where our theatre lives and operates – and that we also commit ourselves and energize our audiences to continually reflect on and respond to our relationship to the land around us. This country has been cared for by generations of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Nations, and the land on which Tarragon rests and is able to share this story has been cherished and protected by the Anishnabeg, the Haudenosaunee, the Wendat, and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Toronto is a word that originates from the Mohawk word “Tkaronto,” meaning “the place in the water where the trees are standing,” which is said to refer to the wooden stakes that were used as fishing weirs in the narrows of local river systems by the Haudenosaunee and Wendat. The paths we still walk today, from Davenport to Dupont, are built on the portage trails first established and walked by Indigenous peoples. It is in the spirit of being on the portage route that we invoke our local Indigenous oral history – though covered up by the industrial progress of Toronto – and maintain that those stories are not lost.

We are committed to engaging with these communities in meaningful ways that open dialogue. We look towards a recognition of our shared humanity to create deeper community connection and accountability. Tarragon’s recognition of the contributions of Indigenous peoples to this land is directly connected to our promise to meet the challenge of Truth and Reconciliation: making our commitment real in our work and through our community building. CREATORS' NOTE

Welcome to *Bremen Town*. I'm so happy you're here.

Folklorist Wilhelm Grimm described fairy tales as “fragments of ancient faith whose purpose was to awaken the feelings of the human heart.”

I believe we all have fragments of ancient faiths collected inside us that come down to us through the generations in many different ways; most notably through the stories we are told. Some universal. Some very personal. They are little pieces of humour, inherited values, beliefs, deep fears, and beautiful inexplicable moments that gather into our psyche like a collection of junk on a table at a flea market. What we do with these fragments and whether we try to make any sense of them is our own business.

Some of my favourite stories growing up were the ones my mother and grandmother told to me about their mothers and grandmothers. Here's one of my fragments:

My mother tells the story of her grandmother, who once ran her house with great dignity and pride, when she was declining and having a difficult time, my grandmother would bring her to the kitchen, sit her in a chair, give her a bowl of peas to shell an hour or so before supper and ask her to help. My mother says she could maybe shell a dozen peas, and it took her the full hour, but she felt she was of use – like she was contributing – like she mattered.

In passing this story down to me, the more immediate message from my own mother was very clear: have patience with me and give me something to do because I know it's coming.

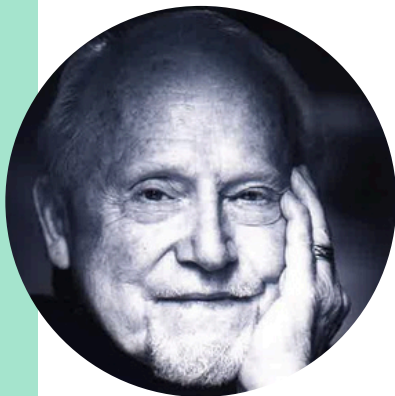
